

From the Sports Council Membership an Executive Committee is elected and this Committee meets monthly.

Broadly, functions of the Sports Council are:

to keep under review, existing sports and recreational facilities in the area;

to assess future needs and advise thereon;

to promote co-operative action in planning, or replanning, sports and recreational provision to serve the needs of the community generally;

to put forward the collective opinion of local sports interest on

matters relating to the use of facilities;

to take appropriate steps, in consultation and collaboration with the local education authorities to encourage school-leavers to continue an active participation in sport.

#### A VISION COME TRUE

"The best thing the English Bowling Association can do, is to stage the next World Championships" —— the soft west-country voice stilled and the soporific effect of the hum of the homeward-bound London traffic on the Planning sub-committee was immediately dispelled, as though by an electric shock. From such small beginnings the present enormously complicated World Bowls organisation owes its origins.

The General Purposes Committee gave the idea hard-headed - and lukewarm - consideration, but an ad hoc Committee of enthusiasts was formed to investigate and report back.

Enquiries to the International Bowling Board in Australia, where the 1966 Championships were held, were set on hand. Tentative approaches to eighteen bowling nations as to possible support were sent out, much midnight oil was burned on the financial implications.


Contacts with possible sponsors were strenuously sought, and days were spent talking to the mayors and officials of South Coast resorts as to the ideal venue - with Worthing ultimately chosen.

All this took place in the early autumn of 1969 and the following months were spent preparing the case for submission to the E.B.A. Council - a revolutionary case that sponsorship should be ignored that bowlers should stand on their own feet and the second largest participant sport (150,000 players) should accept all the financial commitments involved in staging the Championships.

The delegates of the 34 bowling counties of England met in London in March 1970 and the case was put by the Chairman of the ad hoc Committee (Harold Shapland of Tiverton) and myself. £27,000 was required to balance the estimated budget, involving a gross cost of £65,000. Naturally such sums are not lightly approved, but at

the end every county accepted a minimum target figure, which they undertook to raise from their members by October, 1971. So the first hurdle was surmounted.

The heat was now on and much thought and many meetings went into considering the detailed procedures to be adopted, so as to organise the Championships on entirely businesslike lines.

The technical problems were analysed and separate sub-committees established to investigate and recommend to the powerhouse of the organisation - the General Committee, Seating, tickets, umpires, markers, main and rink scoreboards, medical attention, accommodation for the teams and managers and officials, and their travel arrangements, special entertainment and functions, application for a special postal stamp and letter frankings, reception and transport of the teams, catering, television, rules of play, the draw on a league basis, winners medals, display and carrying flags. daily and souvenir programmes, new trophies and by no means least, publicity. For 18 months these matters have been under way. and in most cases finality is being reached. In all these matters the progress would have been considerably slower without the wholehearted assistance of the Mayor of Worthing and all the Corporation officials, this local assistance and encouragement now enabling the final picture to be visualised.

The Championships will be played on the four main greens at Beach House Park, Worthing, from the 5th — 12th June 1972. The opening will be on the morning of Monday June 5th. At least 16 teams will participate, including not only teams from all well-known bowling countries, but also from such romantically named countries such as Fiji, Papua-New Guinea, Malawi, Israel and Hong Kong.

The importance of the occasion is emphasised by the fact that the patrons of the Championships will be: His Grace the Duke of Norfolk, The Earl Beatty, Lord Rupert Nevill and the Mayor of Worthing.

Large visiting parties have already booked in on the South Coast, including parties from Victoria, New South Wales, and from the United States of America, whilst it is known that substantial numbers will be coming from Canada.

It is evident that much thought and planning has been, and is being, given to the development of Sports and Recreational Facilities in Worthing and District.

The project now under construction at West Park stems from an intensified study of the problem made by the Borough Engineer, Surveyor and Planning Officer, Mr. Wilkinson, and his staff at the request of the Parade and Open Spaces Committee in 1968.

His highly detailed report included the then current requirements made by all sectors of Indoor and Outdoor sports in Worthing and District, and listed all the facilities then available, both Public (including Schools) and Private, to satisfy these requirements.

The statistical information showed an anticipated population growth from the present 80,000 to 250,000 by the year 2,000. Coupled with this was a reasoned adjustment showing the probable age imbalance necessary when considering the National Playing Fields standards for Recreational acreage.

It reported also that the catchment area for many Worthing clubs extended far beyond the Borough boundaries and anticipated consequent provision for similar growth.

Due regard was paid to the extensive investment already made by the Borough for sports facilities within the area.

Included also were Mr. Wilkinson's findings of an investigation into the possible provision of a Sports Centre, or two or more split centres. All factors were considered and on balance, bearing in mind the pros and cons of the few sites which could be made available, favoured the erection of one integral Sports Hall and Centre at the present location.

Authorisation for the provision of one Sports Centre followed and the Borough Architect lost no time in providing the plans which are now being implemented.

The Worthing and District Sports Council wishes to express sincere thanks to the Borough, the Borough Council and all the Officers concerned in creating this wonderful opportunity for all the Sportsmen and Sportswomen of Worthing.

#### NEW SPORTS HALL AND GAMES CENTRE, WORTHING

#### Site

The site for the new Sports Hall is situated in the north west corner of West Park Recreation Ground. Its position is well situated for good rail and 'bus connections which will make it readily accessible to a wide catchment area. It is hoped that by siting the building near to the Boys' High School, the Technical High School and the Girls' Secondary School, the schools will be able to use the building both during and immediately after normal school hours. The close proximity of a number of office buildings should provide the opportunity for office workers to make use of the facilities provided during the lunch hour and in the early evening.

#### Planning the Centre

Before setting out to design the building, members of the Council and Officers inspected a number of Local Authority and University Sports Halls and obtained very helpful information from the Sports Hall Managers. This has been invaluable in helping to produce the present design. The building comprises a large hall, 5 squash courts, a practice hall, a weight training hall, a target shooting and archery range together with changing rooms, club room, cafe, bar, offices, first aid room, stores, etc. In addition, a separate changing pavilion for outdoor sports which will replace the existing pavilion is also included. Immediately to the east of the new Sports Hall will be situated a flood lit all-weather pitch which will be available for use throughout the year. By putting an all-weather pitch in this position some protection is afforded from the south west winds and the flank wall of the main building will provide a useful practice wall for tennis and other similar activities. The rest of the site will be marked out with grass pitches and running track. Although some reduction in the grassed area is inevitable, it is still possible to accommodate most of the present outdoor pitches including a running track, plus an outdoor rowing practice tank together with equipment store. Spectators watching outdoor games will be able to buy refreshments from the cafe without entering the main building. Parking for approximately 80 cars will be provided between the new building and the approach to the bridge. National Association standards have been observed in making provision for a wide variety of sports and it will be possible

to provide seating for 640 spectators in the main hall for a variety of events.

#### Access and Exit provisions for participants and visitors.

The main approach to the building will be from Shaftesbury Avenue. Visitors will enter the building past the control kiosk and pass into an entrance fover. On one wall of the fover an information board will be provided on which club notices can be displayed. The building has been designed so that 'indoor shoe' and 'outdoor shoe' users are segregated in the main areas of circulation. Visitors intending to use the main hall, squash courts, weight training or practice halls will first have to pass through the changing rooms and outdoor shoes will not be permitted beyond this point. Having changed, the players will then leave the changing area into a 'clean' corridor which gives direct access to the various halls and squash courts. The reverse procedure will apply when the players have finished their game. The doors between the main hall and the entrance fover will normally be locked and will only be used when spectator events are in progress and at these times the floor of the main hall will be protected against damage caused by outdoor shoes and abrasive material. Members of the public visiting the complex and wishing to use the target shooting and archery range or social rooms will have direct access from the entrance fover without passing through the changing rooms. It will be possible for a small number of spectators to view activities in the main hall and the squash courts from galleries at first floor level.

#### Changing Rooms.

The layout of the changing rooms has been so arranged that any ratio of either sex can be accommodated according to demand. In addition, two separate club changing rooms, complete with showers, are being provided for the use of competing teams. Separate changing rooms for instructors will be provided.

#### Main Hall

The main hall is  $120' \times 120' \times 29'$  high. This space will accommodate a wide range of activities, e.g.

- (c) 2 basketball courts
- (d) 1 five-a-side football pitch

Not all the above courts would be marked out at the same time. A likely arrangement would be 4 badminton courts with one tennis court with an overlay of 1 basketball and 1 netball court. It will be possible to sub-divide the space with canvas net curtains so that different activities can take place at the same time. A mobile tower scaffold will be housed in a store off the main hall so that light fittings can be replaced and the curtain divisions re-arranged with the minimum of inconvenience. Spectators will be accommodated on retractable seating which will normally provide a flush wall surface when not in use. A feature of the main hall will be the internal rock climbing wall which figures prominently on the north wall of the hall. One whole side of the hall is equipped with stores for apparatus and equipment. This aspect of the design has received considerable study to ensure that all equipment can be accommodated in an easily accessible yet economic manner.

#### Practice Hall

The Practice Hall is 40' x 40' x 18' high. The Practice Hall enables beginners to practice in private before taking part in activities in the main hall. The space is ideal for demonstrations and lectures as well as accommodating a variety of sports such as judo, boxing, wrestling, table tennis, fencing, gymnastics and trampoline. Adequate storage will be provided to house a wide range of equipment.

#### Weight Training Hall

The weight training hall is  $33' \times 32' \times 12'$  high. This hall is intended for specialist activities such as judo, boxing, weight training, wrestling and gymnastics. The hall is equipped with its own store and the walls will be specially strengthened to support equipment such as a pulling machine.

#### Squash Courts

The five squash courts are approached from a ground floor corridor. The referees and spectators are able to view the courts from a first floor gallery which also overlooks the main hall. The courts will be artificially lit to provide even light distribution and the ceiling will be acoustically treated. One court will have fixed gallery seating for viewing competition events.

#### Target and Pistol Shooting and Archery

For safety reasons a separate space is being provided for these activities. Special safety precautions will be provided together with an arms safe in which rifles and ammunition will be stored. Noise will be controlled by sound absorbing materials. Immediately adjoining the range is a small club room large enough to accommodate a full size billiard table.

#### Social Rooms

The cafe, bar and club rooms are situated at ground level and open directly on to a terrace providing a view of the outdoor pitches. The kitchen will be equipped for serving light snacks and drinks. A separate licensed bar is to be provided. The club room suite will be arranged so that approximately half the total area can be shut off for the various affiliated clubs to hold Committee meetings or it can be used as a creche during the day. One of the objects of providing the creche is to encourage housewives with young children to use the centre during the off peak hours. These facilities have proved extremely popular in other sports centres throughout

the country. The social centre generally will be arranged in the form of alcoves to provide a warm sociable atmosphere.

#### Ancillary Accommodation

The Manager's Office, first aid room, lavatories for non players, coat store, etc., are all planned on the ground floor in an easily accessible position.

The needs of the handicapped have been taken into account in the planning of circulation, lavatory and changing accommodation. All facilities are provided at ground floor level so that handicapped and elderly people can make full use of the centre as they desire. In fact it is hoped that the centre will be used by all age groups — active and inactive.

The accepted tender for the scheme amounts to £349,800 including some loose furniture and fittings and the construction period will be approximately twenty-one months. The plan permits the addition of sauna baths at a later stage if these are required.






Artist's Impression of Terrace to Social Centre at Durrington.



#### SPORTING ACTIVITIES AROUND THE WORTHING YOUTH CLUBS

Many dedicated people in and around Worthing devote much of their time and energy to ensure the success of the Uniformed and Youth Clubs in the vicinity.

In consequence thousands of youngsters have found a wealth of

interests in the various activities provided.

In his capacity as President of the Mayfield Youth Club our present Mayor, Alderman S.M.Knight, J.P., enlightened us with the following information.

The Youth Clubs and Uniformed Organisations centred in the area have, for several years, taken part in many sporting activities and have had a very great influence in bringing the name of Worthing one to be reckoned with. Football, netball, tennis and table tennis are among those sports particularly popular in the area, and football can be played on outdoor floodlit areas, both on grass or on all weather surfaces.

We have a Committee that concerns itself solely with the running of the Six-a-Side Football League and Tournaments which are held regularly, and for which all age groups within the 11 to 21 years range are catered for, there being separate competitions for minor, junior and senior sections. We also have Eleven-a-Side Teams entered in the Sussex Sunday League and several competitions have been won in recent years by Worthing teams.

The floodlit areas have been provided by a co-operative effort between the Local Authority, who have provided the cash, and a band of dedicated workers who have provided the labour. This area includes a fence some fourteen feet high to protect the main road, for a distance of some eighty vards. This joint effort is of such magnitude that it provides a wonderful example of co-operation, and one which, in these days of shortage of finance, sets an example to other less go-ahead towns provided that among the Club members can be found those who are prepared to work for what they want, and not just sit back and criticise.

Netball is a sport which flourishes under the guidance of an Organising Committee. It is now possible for netball to be played both in summer and winter, as use is made of the all weather pitch in winter, and both summer and winter leagues and tournaments are held regularly. In addition to the normal Youth Service age, the scope has been widened to allow teams from the local business houses to participate, and some 12 to 14 teams play regularly. We have three courts associated with Youth Centres, and some of the business houses are providing their own courts. In fact, at the time of writing, three have already done so, providing six courts for use by League

Table tennis is a well run and successful sport, and caters for many young people during both winter and summer, there being competitions all the year round, and many local clubs participate.

Judo is catered for in one of our Youth Centres, and classes, under the supervision of a qualified instructor, attract both girls and boys and are

gaining in popularity all the time.

Among the more notable and recent successes achieved by our ownWorthing young people in competitions organised by the various County Organisations was the winning of the Eleven-a-Side Association Football Tournament by the Mayfield Youth Club who beat Worthing in the final in April of this year. Mayfield were also the winners of the Six-a-Side Football Tournament

organised by the Sussex Association of Youth Clubs. This success earned for them the right to represent the County of Sussex at the Crystal Palace in the Regional Competition, where again they won through to the National Finals at Edinburgh.

The Worthing Excelsior Cycling Club has a flourishing membership, and has, in recent years provided the winners for the Sussex Junior Ten and

Fifteen Mile Championship events, against very strong opposition.

The Netball Tournament organised by the Sussex Association of Youth Clubs, held this year at Worthing, was also won by the Mayfield Youth Club for the fourth time in five years, and in the Regional Competition held at the Crystal Palace they failed to win a place in the National Finals by a narrow margin on goal average.

Durrington Youth Club and The Quadrant shared the honours in the local Six-a-Side Football Competition. The Worthing Harriers and the Worthing Swimming Club provide many young people with activities, and the Worthing Aguarena is used every week by the Youth Club members, who enjoy the

amenity and have qualified instructors.

Rifle and Small Bore Shooting Clubs exist and have their own ranges. The Worthing Fencing Club have several award winners among its members and

this particular sport is growing in strength from year to year.

Many more sports are played within our boundary than space permits me to mention, except very briefly, these include horse riding, badminton, squash, basketball, etc. These are all played by young and older folk alike, and with the opening of the new Sports Centre will come many more opportunities for our young people to enjoy healthy pursuits.
